Police landed on Anguilla by Frigate

A British frigate, H.M.S. Salisbury, has landed four police officers from St. Kitts on the island of Anguilla (population 5,800) which is part of the St. Kitts-Nevis-Anguilla group in the Leeward Islands. It is due to become an "associated state" with Britain on February 27. Anguilla is 70 miles

from St. Kitts by sea. The landing was made at the request of the St. Kitts Government, because the local police force is small, and there were disturbances on February 4. Three arrests were made and the men were charged later in Basseterre, St. Kitts, in connexion with the disturbances and released on bail. Illicit arms were found in Anguilla.

The Commonwealth Office announced yesterday that the situation in Anguilla was now normal.

Party's Objection

Mrs. Judith Hart, Commonwealth Minister

of State, yesterday had talks with Dr. William Herbert, the leader of the St. Kitts opposition party, the People's Action Movement, which holds the Anguillian constituency in the St. Kitts Parliament.

The P.A.M. has sent a delegation to London to object to certain provisions in the new "associated state" constitution, and to demand irremovable "island councils" for Anguilla and Nevis. The P.A.M. is discontented with the level of social and utility services, and land dealings.

It issued a warning on February 14 that if its demands were not met there would be disturbances to challenge
