

PROVISIONAL CONSTITUTION FOR ANGULLA (continued)
4. The Chairman of the Council shall be elected by the Council and shall be the
Chief Executive Officer of Anguilla. He shall devote full time to his public office,
and shall be compensated therefor. The Council by a majority vote may at any
time over-rule the Chairman, or remove the Chairman from that office and elect some
other member of the Council as Chairman. Should a vacancy on the Council occur for
any reason, the remaining members shall elect a person to fill it.
5. The Council shall have the power to appoint officers, officials, advisers and
employees of all kinds, including magistrates and judges, upon terms fixed by the
Council. The Council shall have the power to appoint judicial officers (including
the power to designate someone already a judge in another jurisdiction) and to
confer upon them the power to decide all civil and criminal cases brought before
them. If the Council chooses, it may designate one or more judges as having the
power to make final decisions, which the Council itself may not set aside. Unless
the Council otherwise provides, all officers and employees of the Government (except members of the Council) serve at the pleasure of the Council.
6. The Council shall act by majority vote. A quorum shall be four, and no less
than three affirmative votes shall be required to take any action.
7. This Provisional Constitution may be amended by the Council, provided that no
less than five members are present, and no less than four votes are in favour of PROVISIONAL CONSTITUTION FOR ANGUILLA (continued) less than five members are present, and no less than four votes are in favour of the amendment. No constitutional arrangement connecting Anguilla with St Kitts shall be effective unless it shall have been submitted to a referendum, and have been approved by a majority of those voting.
